



Intervene in the FERC Process for the Proposed TGP Orion Pipeline Project – Make Your Voice Heard on Record Intervene by Nov 16th or Intervene “out of Time” Shortly After

Intervening on a project that has been filed for approval with FERC is important and valuable: it shows how strongly you are opposed to a project, it preserves your rights to bring a legal challenge should you wish to do so down the road, and it ensures you will be fully informed about every step of the process as it goes forward through email notifications.

When FERC accepts an application it sets a deadline for when interventions should be filed. Interventions can be filed after the established deadline but are often rejected by the agency.

Here are Step by Step Instructions on How to Intervene Online for a FERC Pipeline Docket and sample text needed for the intervention document you will want to file. The FERC Docket # for Orion Pipeline Project is CP 16-4-000.

Below are step by step instructions for intervening via the FERC website if you have created a document to attach and upload in pdf or doc format. FERC accepts other formats also. See FERC website for other acceptable documents. If you cannot create a doc or pdf file to upload in advance, you can also file a “Doc-less” motion to intervene and write in your reasons for intervening without uploading a document. To perform a Doc-less intervention, select “Doc-less motion to intervene” at Step 8 below and type in your intervention language at Step 15 instead of uploading a saved file from your computer. If you have not yet registered on the FERC website with your email address and a password, you will have to do so in order to log in and submit comment:

1. Go to the **FERC.gov website**
2. On the top of the website, click on the tab called **Documents and Filings**
3. Select **Eregister**
4. **Login** or register
5. On the left side of the screen, select the tab for **Efiling**

6. On the main section of the screen, three columns will appear. On the *left of the three columns*, **select general**
7. Then on *center of the three columns* select **intervention**
8. On the *right of the three columns*, select **motion to intervene** (if you are filing without a pdf or document to upload – you can select “Doc-less motion to intervene” at this step).
9. Click **next**
10. **Enter docket number** (ex: TGP Orion Docket Number: CP 16-4)
11. Click **next**
12. Under the Select column, click the **plus sign**
13. Click **next**
14. In the **description box**, **write** *Motion to Intervene of [your name] for the TGP Orion Pipeline Project (or if you are doing a doc-less intervention, you can write in your contact info and reasons for intervening in the box – take note 6,000 characters are allowed only for Doc-less motions)*
15. Choose file: **upload PDF** (*must be PDF, doc format or other acceptable FERC file format*) (see sample text below) (no file upload needed for doc-less motion – just type in your information for your intervention)
16. Click **upload** if you are uploading a file
17. Click **next** (you don’t need to select anything else)
18. Affiliation box: If you are affiliated with an organization, write it here, if not, leave this space blank
19. **Enter contact email**
20. Click **next**
21. **Add a signer**, select yourself
22. Click **next**
23. **Provide/edit the description** of your submission as you choose
24. Confirm that information is accurate
25. Click **submit**. You should receive a confirmation email that your comment was submitted. Keep a copy of that for your records.

You can also intervene by mail. To do so, you must send an original copy of the motion to intervene and 3 copies to: Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, 888 First Street, N.E., Washington, DC 20426

Sample Petition Language Below for Intervening – yellow identifies where information must be added – if you do a doc-less motion to intervene be sure to include all pertinent information in yellow highlight sections for a complete filing:

MOTION FOR LEAVE TO INTERVENE

Pursuant to Rules 212 and 214 of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's (“Commission”) Rules of Practice and Procedure, 18 C.F.R. § 385.212 and 385.214 (2007), I, **name here**, files this motion to intervene in this proceeding.
